Technology has been identified as a professional development priority, as we have expanded the number of devices significantly. We utilize Google certified individuals from other districts, along with in-house staff, to provide Google Classroom and other technology training.
We are providing intensive training in STEM initiatives, including Robotics and Project Lead the Way.

Describe activities

Our district has offered the opportunity to attain a Master's degree on-site through Missouri Baptist University. Through the students in this cohort, we have the opportunity to "sell" our district and recruit teachers. We are adding a specialist cohort in August, 2020.

Assisting preschool children in the transition from early childhood education programs to local elementary school programs

Describe activities

Our early childhood programs are housed in our elementary school, so there is a great deal of interaction among preschool students and elementary age students. Staff participate in all PLC, PD, and staff meetings with the elementary and district staff. In addition, we have a combined PAT, PreK and Kindergarten screening each spring.
